Iwi Perspective: Taoho Patuawa (Te Roroa, Ngāti Whātua, Ngāpuhi) of Te Roroa

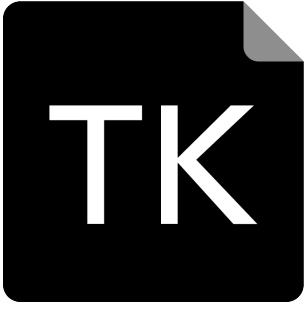
